## ANNE ARUNDEL COUNTY

**Free HIV Counseling and Testing:** Testing may be either confidential (a protected record is kept with your name on it) or anonymous (no name used). For an appointment at a health center near you, call 410-222-7108.

**A Service for Telling Your Partner:** A specially trained person helps people with HIV/AIDS to let their sex partner or other contacts know if they should be tested. This is done without naming the HIV positive person. Call 410-222-7176 and ask for the staff person who does "partner notification."

#### Case Management:

This service helps people with HIV/AIDS get services they may need, such as:

- Primary medical & dental care
- Family support
- Pharmacy coverage
- Client advocacy
- Transportation
- Nutritional counseling
- Emotional support & counseling
- Social service, mental health & substance abuse referrals
- Information on HIV/AIDS & related health issues

**Substance Abuse Referrals:** Inpatient and outpatient treatment referral services are available. Contact the case management supervisor at 410-222-7108 or call Adult Addiction Services at 410-222-0100.

**HIV Outreach and Education:** Trained staff help young people and adults learn ways to prevent HIV and other STDs through programs where learning is fun. Games, poetry, role-plays, skits and skill practice are used in the sessions. The free programs can be tailored to the needs of the individual or group. Programs are also available for Spanish speaking individuals and groups. Call 410-222-7108 for more information and schedules.

## MEDICAL AND PHARMACY ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

**Primary Adult Care (PAC):** PAC offers services to people 19 and over that have limited amounts of money. Call 1-800-226-2142 to ask for a PAC application.

**Maryland AIDS Drug Assistance Program (MADAP):** This program helps income-eligible Maryland residents who are infected with HIV to get the medicines that are needed to treat, prevent or relieve certain HIV related conditions. To find out how to apply, call your case manager at 410-222-7108 or AIDS Administration Client Services at 1-800-205-6306.

**Maryland AIDS Drug Assistance Program-Plus (MADAP-Plus):** MADAP helps pay a portion of insurance premiums for people who are HIV infected or who do not qualify for MAIAP due to income/assets or immigration status. 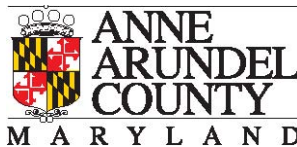
