GROUP SUPPORT SESSIONS

Addictions – A support group for HIV positive individuals who are working on recovery from substance abuse.	1st and 3rd Monday of every month
Common Thread – A support group that provides a safe place for HIV positive individuals seeking to give and to receive support, share information, experiences and feelings.	2nd and 4th Monday of every month
Women's Group – A comfortable environment for HIV positive women to share personal issues/ health concerns, etc.	2nd and 4th Wednesday of every month
Friends Group – A relaxed setting which allows HIV positive individuals to come together to socialize and enjoy participating in fun activities together.	1st Thursday of every month.
Gay Men's Group – A comfortable environment for HIV positive homosexual men to share personal issues/ health concerns, etc.	1st and 3rd Wednesday of every month
Individual Counseling – One hour sessions that focus on the individual and continuity of care needs.	As needed
