
Anne Arundel County Teen Births, 2013-2017

Over the past 5 years the number of births to teen mothers in Anne Arundel County has declined. In 2013 there were 254 births to females aged 19 and younger compared to 195 births in 2017. The majority of teen births (67%) in 2017 were to mothers between the ages of 18-19 years.

Hispanic females experienced a 31% increase in teen birth rates between 2013 and 2017, compared to a 40% decrease for black teens and 25% decrease for whites.


Contraception Use by Anne Arundel County High School Students During Last Sexual Intercourse, Maryland Youth Risk Behavior Survey 2014 vs 2016

Disparities still exist by racial and ethnic group. In 2017, birth rates for Hispanic teens (15-19) were 5 times higher than birth rates for white teens; rates; for black teens doubled rates for white teens.
