YTD 2017 TOTAL OVERDOSES

This is an 18% increase from the 838 overdoses in 2016.

75% of overdoses are male.

60% of overdoses are between the ages of 20 and 34.

The hours between 5:00 pm and 1:00 am and Wednesday, Fridays and Saturdays account for around 50% of the total overdoses.



YTD 2017 FATAL OVERDOSES


The proportion of fatal overdoses to all overdoses has remained steady at 13-14% compared to last year.





The number of fatal overdoses were broken down by opioid type. Over 60% of overdoses involved fentanyl.
