This is a 18.4% decrease from the 967 overdoses YTD 2020.




### 2021 FATAL OVERDOSES

This is a 15.4% decrease from the 175 fatal overdoses YTD 2020.



# Substances Involved in Fatal Opioid Overdoses YTD 2021 (n=148)


