This is a 10.6% decrease from the 644 overdoses YTD 2020.




2021 FATAL OVERDOSES

This is a 8.5% decrease from the 118 fatal overdoses YTD 2020.



Substances Involved in Fatal Opioid Overdoses YTD 2021 (n=108)




