This is a 12.3% decrease from the 717 overdoses YTD 2020.




2021 FATAL OVERDOSES

This is a 7.0% decrease from the 128 fatal overdoses YTD 2020.



Substances Involved in Fatal Opioid Overdoses YTD 2021 (n=119)


