2019 TOTAL OVERDOSES


This is a 21.2% decrease from the 923 overdoses YTD 2018.



This is a 20.4% decrease from the 147 fatal overdoses YTD 2018.





Opioid Overdose Demographics

The rate of opioid overdoses increased more than 60% in Black males from 2017 to 2018 but either decreased or remained stable in the other demographic groups.
