2019 TOTAL OVERDOSES


This is a 34.9% decrease from the 152 overdoses YTD 2018.




2019 FATAL OVERDOSES

This is a 39.3% decrease from the 28 fatal overdoses YTD 2018.






Hospital Encounters for Opioid-Related Diagnoses** YTD 2019 (n= 107)
