This is a 9.2% increase from the 65 overdoses YTD 2019.




2020 FATAL OVERDOSES

This is a 20.0% increase from the 10 fatal overdoses YTD 2019.



Substances Involved in Fatal Opioid Overdoses YTD 2020 (n=12)



Fentanyl Test Strips

Anne Arundel County Department of Health's AAPower Program began distributing fentanyl test strips in the community in August 2019. To date, 1,164 strips have been distributed.
