### **2020 TOTAL OVERDOSES**


This is a 9.0% increase from the 532 overdoses YTD 2019.




#### **2020 FATAL OVERDOSES**

This is a 3.2% increase from the 95 fatal overdoses YTD 2019.





#### **AA POWER**

The Anne Arundel County Department of Health's AA POWER program seeks to bring harm reduction services to county residents. Since the program began in August 2019, they have done more than 47 outreach events where they distributed 2,593 fentanyl test strips and 1,701 naloxone kits in the community.
