PROSTATE CANCER

KNOW THE FACTS

WHAT IS PROSTATE CANCER?

Cancer in the prostate gland (produces semen fluid). Affects men. Grows slowly in most cases.

WHAT IS THE PROSTATE?

Gland below the bladder. Surrounds the urethra. Size varies with age.

RISK FACTORS

Age: Biggest risk, increases sharply after 50. **Family History:** Father/brother with prostate

cancer doubles risk.

Race/Ethnicity: Higher risk: African American, Caribbean men of African descent Lower risk:

Asian American, Hispanic/Latino.

SYMPTOMS

Urination problems (frequent, painful, weak flow). Blood in urine/semen.

Persistent back, hip, or pelvic pain.

Painful ejaculation.

SCREENING

Digital Rectal Exam (DRE):

Doctor feels the prostate for lumps.

Prostate-Specific Antigen (PSA) Test:

Blood test to measure PSA levels (protein produced by the prostate).

IMPORTANT QUESTIONS FOR YOUR DOCTOR:

Am I at higher risk?
When should I start screening?
What if my PSA test is normal?
What is a biopsy and how's it done?
What are the risks of treatment?

Talk to your doctor about screening benefits and risks. Most insurance covers PSA tests.
