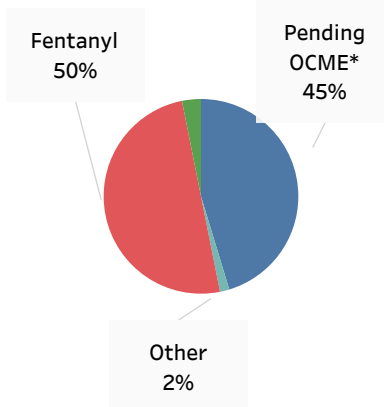
**2022 FATAL OVERDOSES**

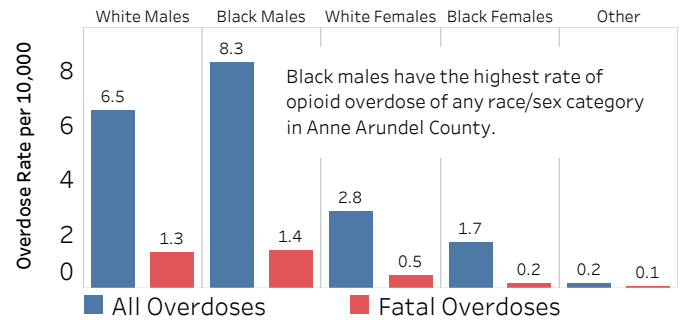
### Substances Involved in Fatal Opioid Overdoses YTD 2022 (n=64)

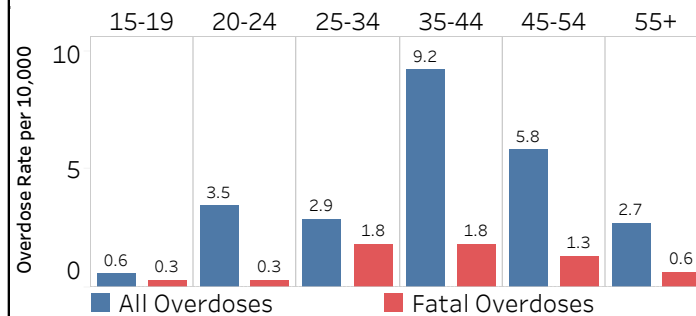


Substances can include fentanyl, heroin, heroin/fentanyl mix, opioid analogues and other opioid substances.

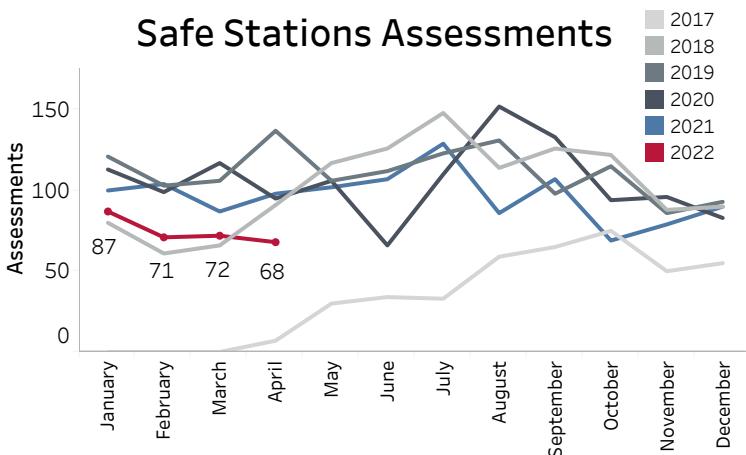
### Opioid Overdose Demographics, YTD 2022



### Opioid Overdoses by Age, YTD 2022



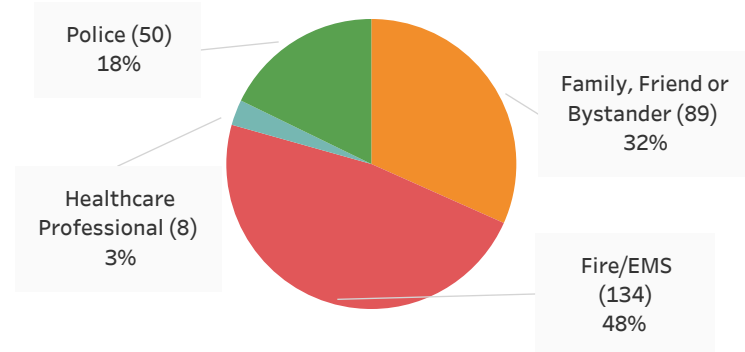

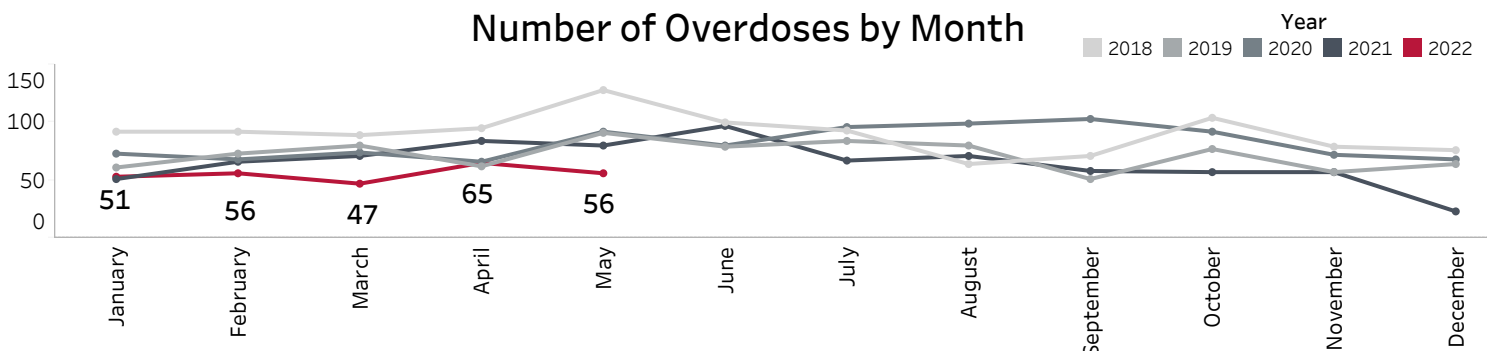

### Number of Overdoses by Month

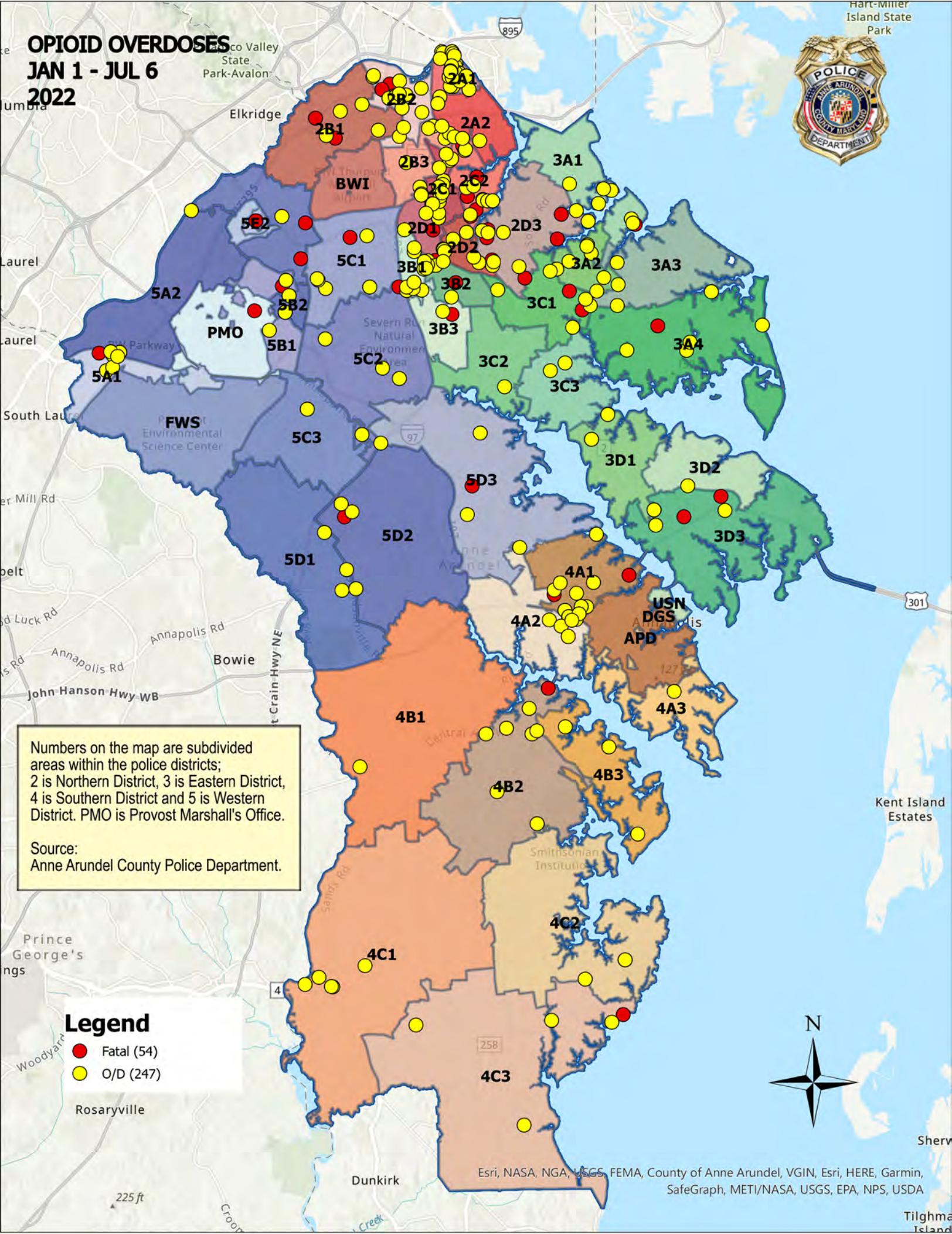
