This is a 1.3% decrease from the 863 overdoses YTD 2017.

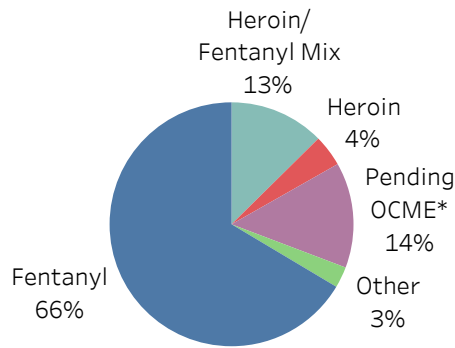

This is a 19.2% increase from the 120 fatal overdoses YTD 2017.

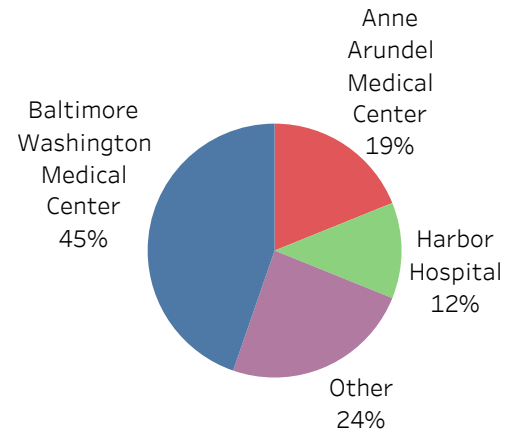

Substances Involved in Fatal Overdoses, YTD 2018 (n=143)



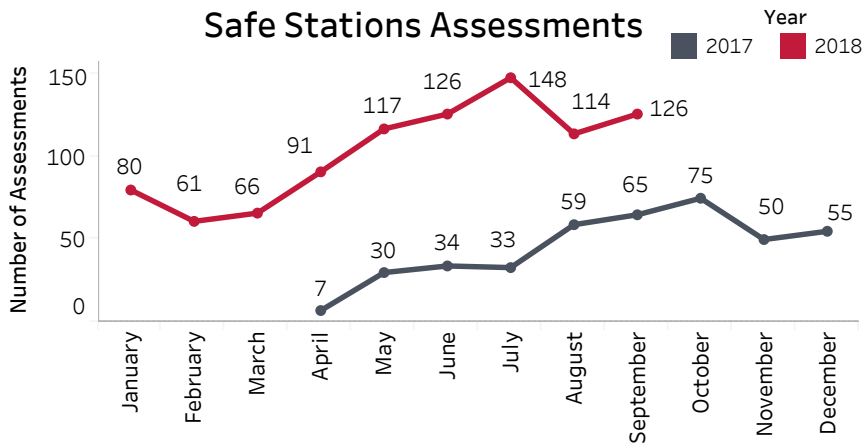

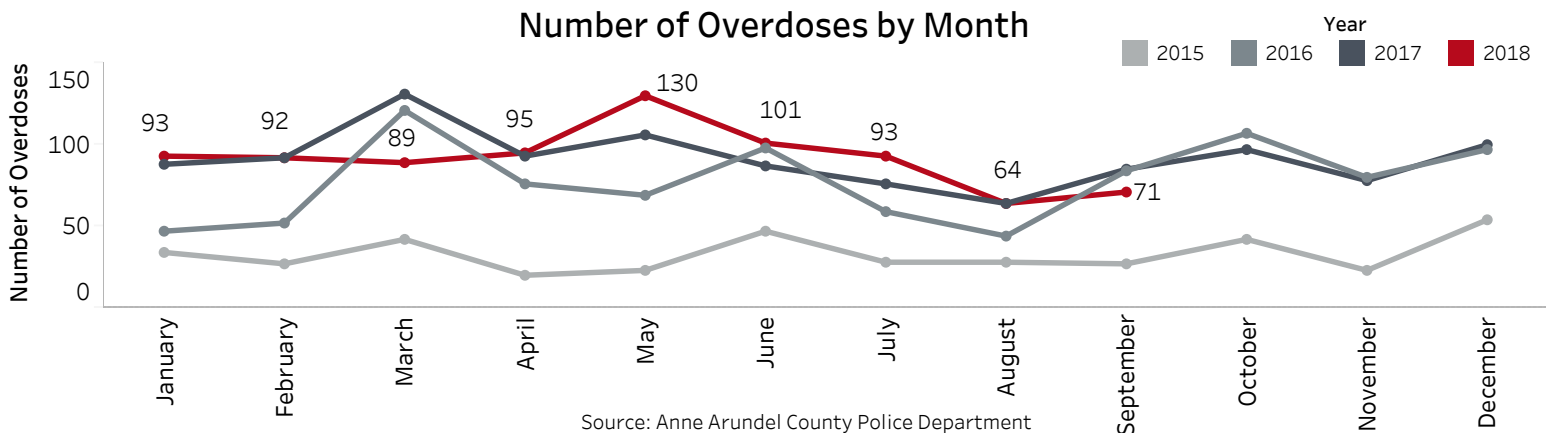

Number of Overdoses by Month

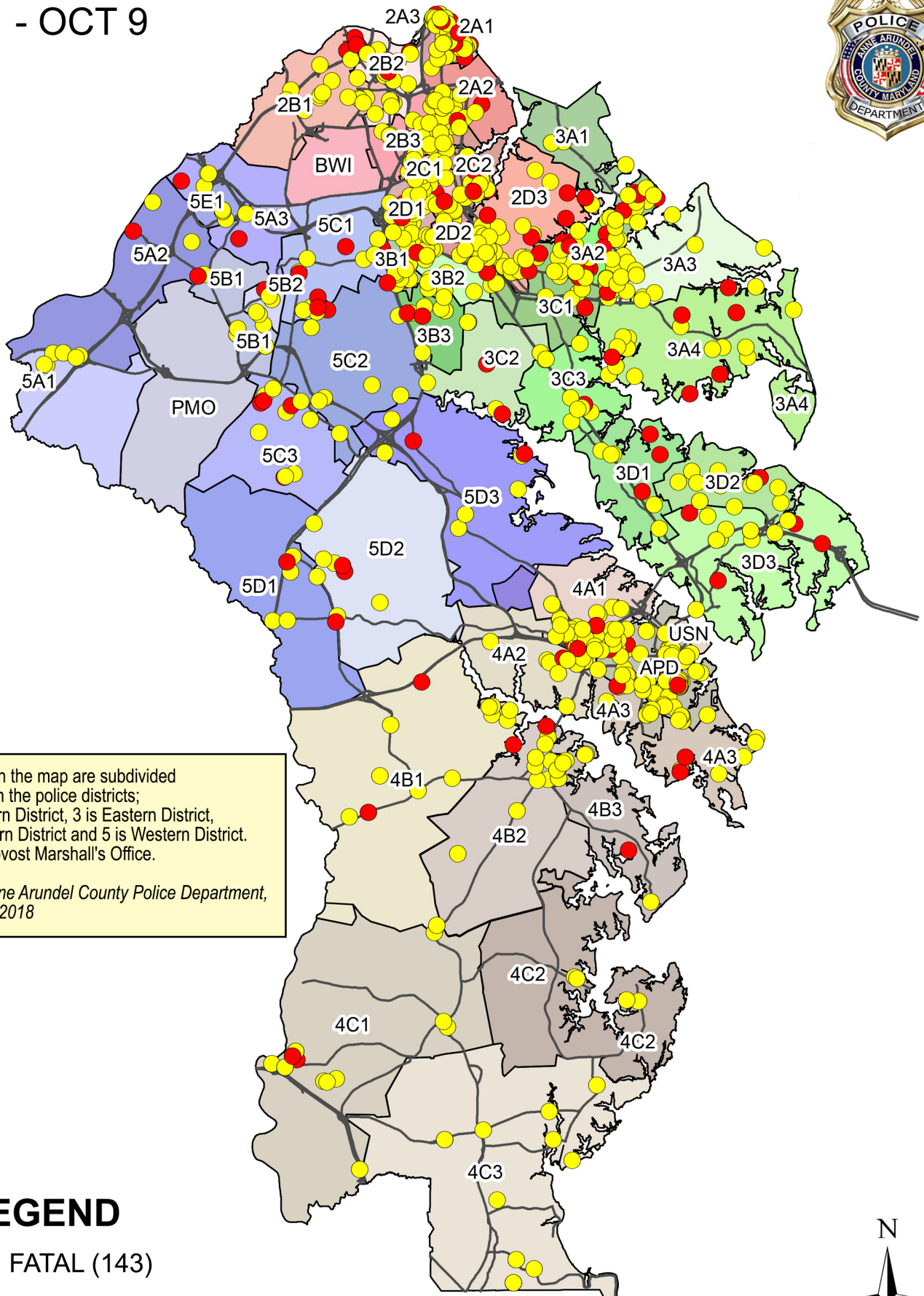
