This is a 11.5% increase from the 122 overdoses YTD 2019.

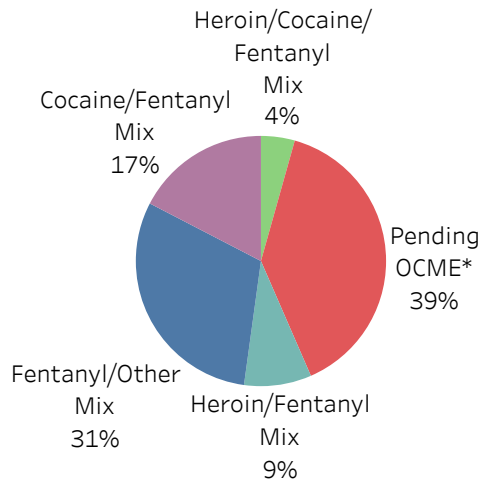

This is a 21.1% increase from the 19 fatal overdoses YTD 2019.

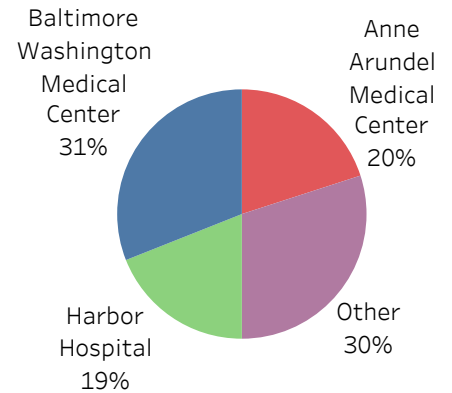

Substances Involved in Fatal Opioid Overdoses YTD 2020 (n=23)



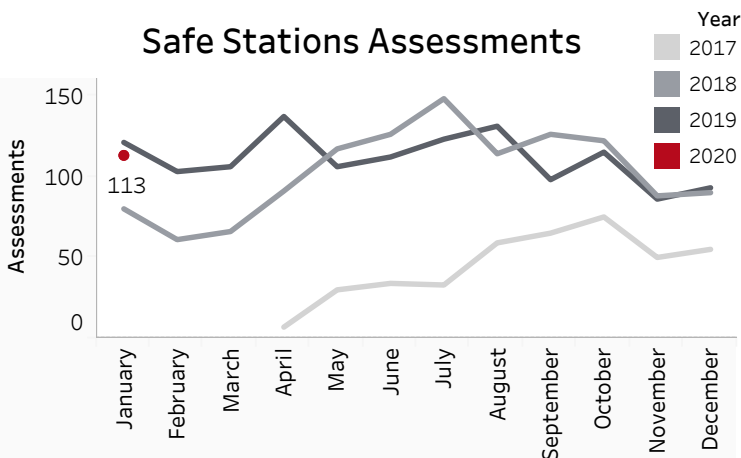

Anne Arundel County Department of Health's AAPower Program began distributing fentanyl test strips in the community in August 2019. To date, 1,164 strips have been distributed. 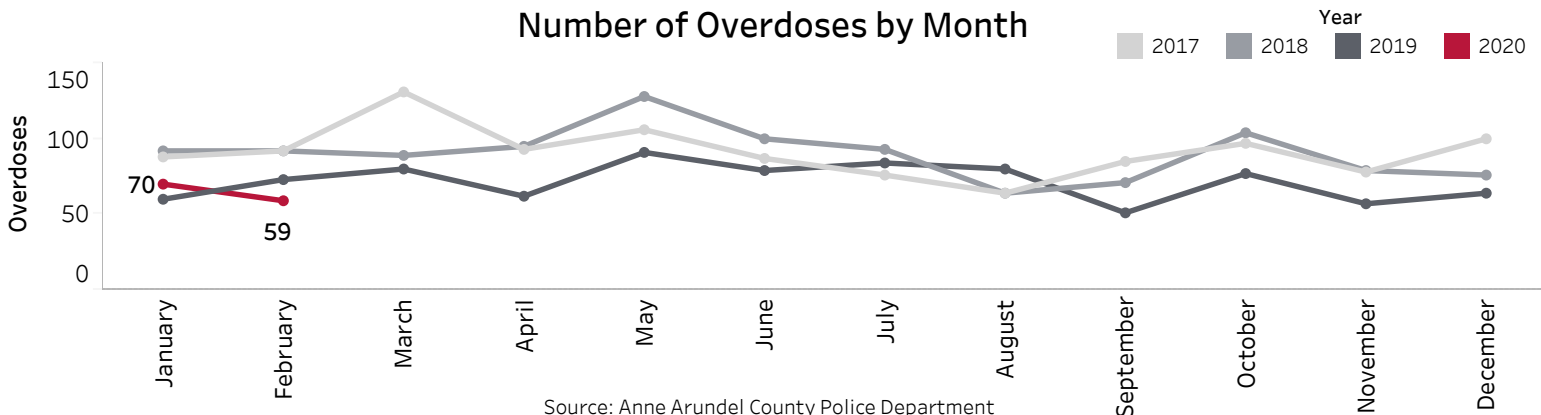

Number of Overdoses by Month

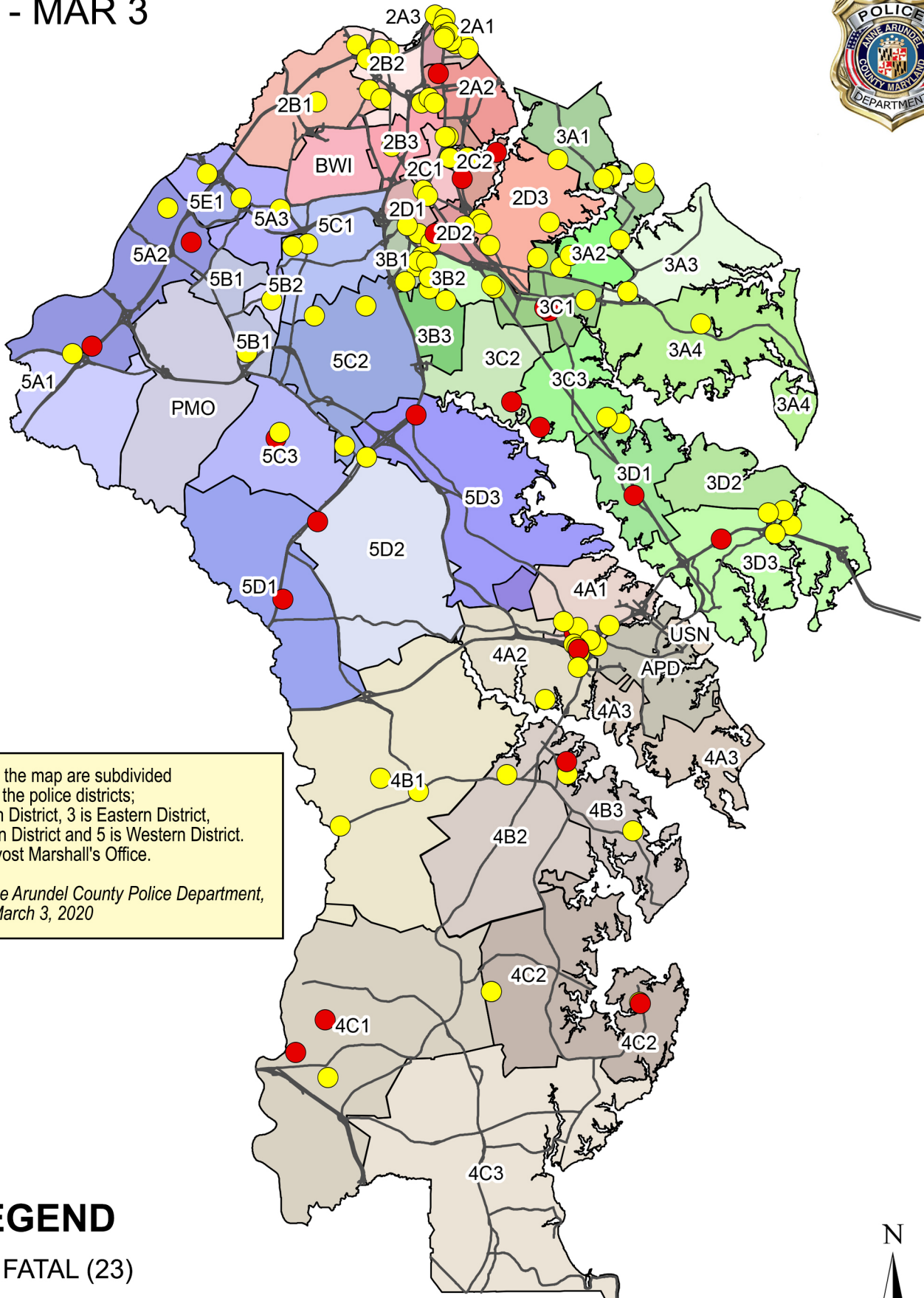
